Angela Mo

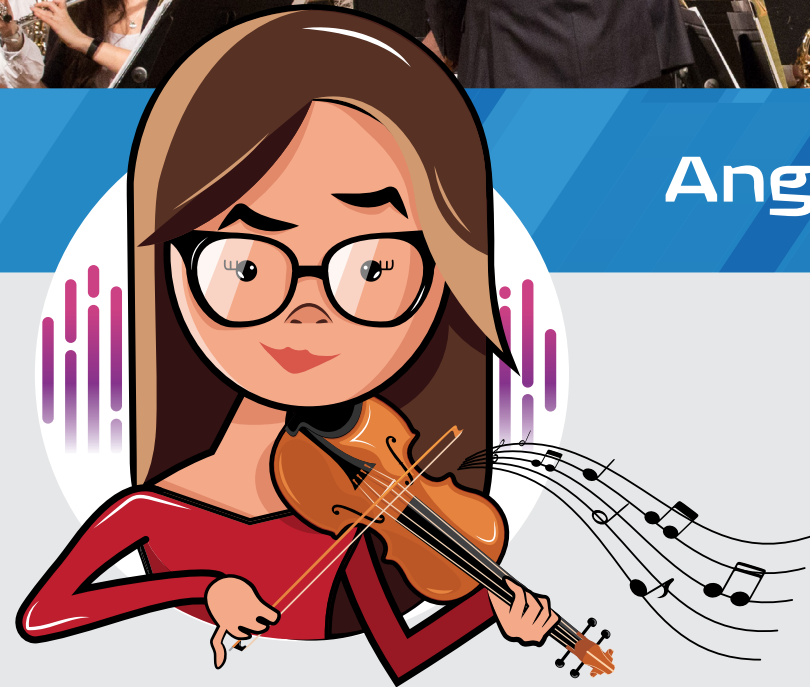
Grade Level: Senior

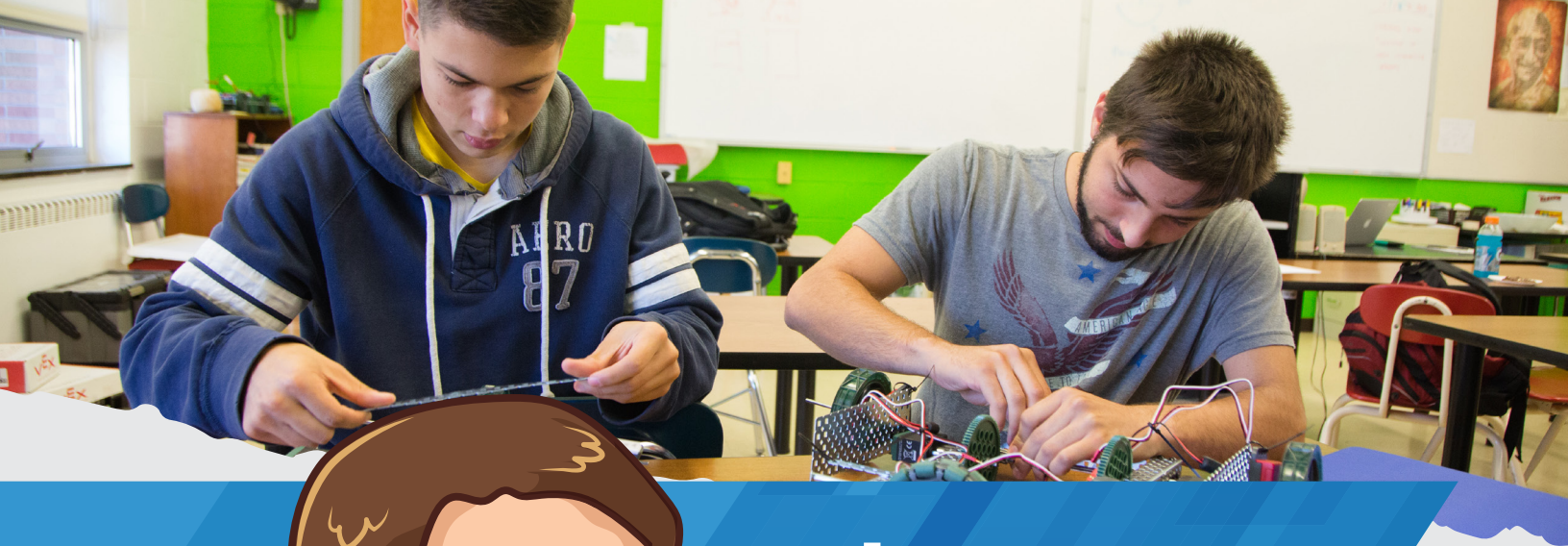
